REGIONAL RECLAMATION FACILITY EXPANSION

Will allow the facility to meet the growing service area needs for reclaiming sewer water into beneficial recycled water.

CANYON LAKE WATER TREATMENT PLANT UPGRADE

Will improve water quality and ensure the water meets state and federal mandated regulations.

DIAMOND REGIONAL LIFT STATION PROJECT

Will increase capacity by upgrading current sewer facilities and improving flows into EVMWD's wastewater treatment facilities from the southern end of Lake Elsinore.




